Accounting GPA Specifics:

- Applicants for admission to the accounting major will be accepted upon completion of a minimum of 45 credit hours with a K-State cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above
- Students admitted to the major will be placed on a one semester probation if they fail to make satisfactory progress in their program or fail to maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above in their accounting courses
- Only ONE probationary semester is permitted per student during their academic career
- A student will be denied continued enrollment in the major if they fail to remove the deficiency during the one semester probationary period
- Students dismissed from the major are required to have a 2.5 GPA in ALL accounting courses in order to return to the accounting major

CPA/CMA Notes:

- Students preparing to sit for the Certified Public Accountant (CPA) examination in the State of Kansas must complete at least 150 hours of college credit including two courses in legal aspects of business or business law.
- Students preparing to sit for the Certified Management Accounting (CMA) examination are advised to elect the following courses: MANGT 520 (Organizational Behavior) and ECON 520 (Intermediate Microeconomics).
