

Thematic Sequence Completion Options

1. Complete a minimum of nine hours from a single, nonbusiness academic department
 - a) six hours must be at the 300-level or higher (or)
 - b) three hours at the 300-level if another course and its prerequisite are used in the sequence
2. Complete a nonbusiness major, secondary major, or minor
3. Complete a nonbusiness certificate
4. Complete any one of the approved sequences listed below*

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Courses will share a common theme so they may collectively provide a greater, more in-depth understanding of an academic area outside that of business
- Provides an emphasis area or area of interest
- Courses used in the Thematic Sequence cannot be used to complete any other CBA major requirement
- No more than six hours of coursework may be used from a two-year college
