Note: It's common for students to use Unrestricted Electives to complete business or non-business minors/certificates!

Things to Consider

When deciding on Unrestricted Electives, you may consider the following items to aid choosing classes:

- Do I want classes that provide skills, such as additional business or personal finance knowledge, or leadership skills?
 - *You can take additional Business courses, they just cannot be courses that you already need or have taken towards your degree.*
- Do I want classes that are meant to provide additional outside of class experiences, such as internships or practicums?
- Do I want classes that are for leisure or fitness skill building, such as workout classes or wine tasting (21+ only)?
- How many credits do I actually need? Should I stack two 1-credit courses, or should I take a 3-credit course? (You can check on your graduation plan!)
- Will I still be full-time if I choose to break up 3 or 2-credit unrestricted electives?

Remember: Unrestricted Electives can be anything 100-level or higher!
